- <u>Apply</u> for benefits online at https://dol.georgia.gov/unemployment-benefits or by phone to the local unemployment office.
- <u>Must</u> apply for UI and be denied to be considered for PUA. You will receive additional information to apply for PUA from the Georgia Department of Labor (DOL).
- If you qualify for either UI or PUA, you may receive up to \$365 plus \$600 per week.
- Can earn up to \$300 gross wages per week and receive unemployment benefits.
- Can receive social security retirement or survivors benefits and unemployment benefits.
- Once approved, you <u>must</u> certify weekly with DOL to continue receiving benefits.
